Time

“Be joyful always; *pray continually*; give thanks in all circumstances ...”
1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

God gives each of us 24 hours in a day and 168 hours in a week. While we all have a different number of days on this earth, time remains our most valuable commodity. It is up to each of us to effectively manage our time to bring glory and honor to God through the lives we lead.

We have a need to balance all the different and often competing demands in our life. We need to find time for family, for work, for service to others, for recreation, for rest and, of course, for prayer and worship. Each of these commitments is important and beneficial to a balanced, productive life.

But as Christians, aware that our lives are gifts from God, do we make “time for God” a priority in our busy lives? Do we reserve the one hour each week God asks for, where we join together on Sunday with our parish community to worship as the Body of Christ? Do we center our lives around the Eucharist, making it the “source and summit” of our life as Catholic Christians? Do we make time, with our family, to join in prayer – acknowledging the Lord’s dominion in our lives, thanking Him for the blessings He has given us, and laying our needs and the needs of others at His feet?

Talents are the special gifts that are uniquely ours. We hold the conviction that every member of our faith community has been given talents as gifts from God. Treasure

“For where your treasure is, there *your heart will also be.*”

Matthew 6:21

For many of us, it is not easy to admit that our treasure has more to do with God’s benevolence than with our own hard work or brilliant mind. But all of our possessions – including money – are gifts from God, who gave us these gifts so that we will care for them and find ways to use them to improve the lives of our families and others.

Even the less affluent among us are rich in comparison to the rest of the world. Most of us live with a material abundance, but the Lord seeks our generosity not just from our abundance but even from our substance. Why? Because each of us has both the responsibility and the inherent desire to help others.

We all have different levels of income and different material resources, but we are each called to return in thanksgiving to God a proportionate gift. We are not called to give the same gifts; rather we are called to share the same sacrifice.

A steward acknowledges that the biblical tradition of tithing is still a goal for all. Our Church has long suggested that 10% of our income be offered in thanksgiving for all God has provided. Although the proper level of sacrifice for each household will be attained only after prayer, God asks that we return a significant share of the blessings He has given us by financially supporting His kingdom on earth, recognizing that our sacrifice should come from our first fruits of God’s blessings and not from what is left over.

As a steward committed to journey toward a tithe, let us put our trust in God, take the leap of faith, and make a commitment to a Stewardship Way of Life. Perhaps some of our financial commitments won’t allow us to start at a 10% tithe immediately, but we should not be afraid to start somewhere.
