## Stewardship...

This week we begin the season of Advent and the start of a new liturgical year. Pause here to think about how the Word of God as proclaimed each week and highlighted in these articles can lead you to becoming a stronger steward -



a steward who uses all the gifts God has entrusted to him for the good of others.

We have arrived at the beginning of the liturgical year and the season of Advent, a season to prepare with awe and gratitude for the coming Feast of the Incarnation of Jesus, born to us as our Savior and as our brother. This is also a season to prepare for His return at the end of time. It is a time to remind ourselves that our individual judgment day is coming, too — the moment when we will be called to give an account for all the love God has shown us and the gifts He has entrusted to us during our lifetime.

An important document on stewardship published by the Diocese of Wichita titled The Pillars of Parish Stewardship says, "God reveals His perfect and infinite love for us most visibly in His son, Jesus Christ. A steward makes God's love visible by imitating Jesus... Stewardship is the response of the disciple to God's unconditional love for us. Stewards bask in the wonder and awe of God's love." In other words, Advent is a steward's season!

Our readings for the first week of Advent waste no time in calling our urgent attention to these themes of reflection and preparation. They seem to shout, "Wake up! Get ready!" and they offer us some practical advice to make the most of this Season.

The Gospel from Luke warns, "Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life."

How easy it is to lose focus on our Lord either by too much indulgence in our lives or by too much worry about our lives. Both extremes are easy to fall prey to. To avoid these traps, we are told to "be vigilant" and "pray for strength to sustain us." During Advent, we Christian stewards must ask ourselves some hard questions. Am I staying faithful to my prayer life? Am I using my energy and skills to serve others? Am I overly concerned about material gain? Am I relying on my "stuff" or my investments as my source of comfort or security? Am I living for the moment, and forgetting the coming of the Lord?

Our Second Reading from Thessalonians offers us a beautiful Advent prayer as we move through this season of reflection and preparation. Let us make it our prayer for each other: "May the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all... so as to strengthen your hearts, to be blameless in holiness before our God and Father at the coming our Lord Jesus with all his holy ones. Amen."


As Paul admonished the people of Thessaloniki, as Christian stewards we need to get ready for Christ's coming by examining your conscience about how you are using the gifts that God has entrusted to us to help our brothers and sisters in Christ! He is coming! Alleluia!! Let us prepare with awe and wonder.

#### Thoughts to reflect on:

During Advent we are called to be vigilant and alert, but not in a passive way. We must be active in our faith and be prepared and practice for the coming of Christ so that when that moment comes, we know that we are prepared to go forward. We do this by living out a strong Christian life so that we foster a relationship with God and our family and community.

We pray often and serve others willingly. We encounter Christ in the face of the poor and witness to our faith by the lives we lead. As Christian stewards, one way to meet Jesus' call to love and serve God and our neighbor, is to use the gifts God has entrusted to us to share His love and these gifts by using them to help others. Then when our time comes, we can sing with the choirs of Angels, "Let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord."



Simbang Gabi (Night Mass) is a revered Filipino Catholic tradition that consists of nine consecutive dawn masses, celebrated from December 16 to December 24, in preparation for Christmas. Rooted in both religious devotion and cultural heritage, it symbolizes faith, gratitude, and hope as the community gathers to honor the anticipation of Christ's birth. Originating during the Spanish colonial period, it was designed to accommodate farmers who could attend mass before their workday began. Simbang Gabi is distinguished by its festive atmosphere, with churches adorned in colorful parols (lanterns), traditional hymns, and shared delicacies like arroz caldo (chicken porridge) and bibingka (rice cakes) enjoyed after mass. It remains a profound expression of Filipino spirituality and cultural identity, fostering reflection, unity, and joy as Christmas approaches.

The Holy Trinity Parish will be celebrating Simbang Gabi Friday, December 20, 2024 at 6:00PM Bilingual mass in English and Tagalog. Worship aids will be available for non-Tagalog speakers.

In keeping with the tradition, the Filipino Ministry is sponsoring a feast with entertainment and dance immediately following the mass. Please join us for free dinner consisting of favorite Filipino delicacies. <u>The dinner event is by reservation only and seats are limited.</u>
