
Questions for Faith Sharing Oct. 13 Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In next Sunday's Gospel, Mark 10:17-30, Jesus, with love and compassion, challenges the man to keep the commandments and to live in service to the poor and marginalized. Jesus doubles down with the well-known image of a camel traversing a needle's eye as easier than entrance of the rich into the kingdom of God. • Is helping serve the poor and/or marginalized a priority in your life? If not, how can you change that?


