Questions for Faith Sharing Feb. 2 The Presentation of the Lord

In next Sunday's Gospel, Luke 2:22-32, he commemorates the occasion that Mary and Joseph bring Jesus to be presented to the temple in Jerusalem in accordance with Jewish law. Throughout Luke's Gospel, it was most important that a disciple be ready for Jesus' appearance and then respond with faith. This was not easy since Israel had waited for an anointed savior for over five hundred years. Despite that delay, the sense of expectation had grown stronger over time. In Luke's mind at least, this growing hope was the work of the Holy Spirit.

Today we continue our focus on how our Sunday readings help us put God first in our lives by sharing the gifts and blessings he has entrusted to us.



ThirdSundayinOrdinaryTimeNEH 8: 2-4A, 5-6, 8-10; PS 19: 8-10, 15; 1 COR 12:12-30Today's Second Reading, from St. Paul's first letter tothe Corinthians, picks up where we left off last week andcontinues with a similar theme. His message is that weare each unique in the gifts and talents God has given tous, and therefore, we all have different tasks to fulfill asmembers of the body of Christ.

What is further developed this week is the truth that, though different in our roles, every single individual is equally important and needed in the Church, from the newly baptized newborn to the teenager sitting reluctantly by his parents, to the elderly shut-in who can no longer attend Sunday Mass. "God placed the parts, each one of them, in the body as he intended. If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is there are many parts, yet one body."

What does this teach us as Christian stewards? It shows us that we all have equal dignity and worth in God's sight, and that if God sees us as equally precious, we should view each other in this same light. It teaches us to humbly recognize our own gifts as well as the giftedness of every member of our parish family. And, while God designed us to be ultimately dependent on Him, it seems He has also designed us to need each other! This is part of the beauty and richness of a stewardship way of life. No one person can "do it all" in life — whether in family life or parish life. But God does not ask us to do it all. He simply asks us to share the gifts and talents we do have in the season of life we find ourselves right now.

And just what are we, as Christian stewards, aiming to achieve by sharing our gifts? We are aiming to follow in the footsteps of our Lord, furthering with His grace the mission He began 2,000 years ago. He declares in the Gospel reading from St. Luke today what this mission is: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free...." What a noble purpose! What great dignity has been bestowed upon us, modern-day disciples, that we are called to this same task because "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me...."
