


Questions for Faith Sharing Mar. 2 Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Jesus knows how destructive and empty hypocrisy can be. By contrast, integrity has a multiplier effect. When disciples express their faith in God through kindness, generosity, mercy and forgiveness, they inspire similar efforts and faith in the people they encounter. Stewardship – What is a Stewardship Way of Life? Part Two



Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Deacon Jim's thoughts on Stewardship:

This week I will continue my review of with Part Two of what "stewardship" and a "stewardship way of life" is and isn't. As I wrote last week, Holy Trinity Parish has been a Stewardship Parish for almost 20 years. We need to continue our work as Christian Stewards as we give thanks to God for all His gifts that He has entrusted to us.

Remember from Part One, stewardship is not just about money or contributions, it is about committing to live a life of gratitude by giving back to God the gifts of Time, Talent, and Treasure that he has entrusted to us. We ask ourselves the question, *"What return can I make to the Lord for all the Lord has given to me?"* (Ps 116:12)

Also, Stewardship isn't a scheme to bring in more money or volunteers. It's not a "program" or a "campaign." **Stewardship is a Way of Life** – where stewards start to look at **everything good** as a gift from God to be used to build up his Kingdom. These gifts were entrusted to us by God, they aren't ours to hoard. They are to be used to serve God and others. These gifts are my Time, Talent, and Treasure. Stewardship is the realization that "*the earth and all that is in it belongs to the Lord.*" (Ps 24:1)

In Part Two, I suggest you ask yourself another more fundamental question, "**Who is Jesus to me?**" Yes, he is our Savior and Lord, but_He was also the perfect steward. He was given the kingdom which was entrusted to his care to show us how we are to care (love) and serve others by following his example._As a Christian Steward, we must discern how we can have a change of heart that will result in changing our lives and changing our culture as a follower of Christ. Our Goal should be I'm doing this out of gratitude so that I can be as generous to others as God has been to me. And I am using my life and the gifts that God has entrusted to me for the benefit of others and to build up God's kingdom in all that I do.

Finally, the scriptural concept of stewardship is rooted not in need, but in using what God has entrusted to us to build the Kingdom. There are many references to stewardship in scripture, but one I like is the one Jesus gave us at the Last Supper when he said: "I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, you also should love one another. This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (Jn 13:34-35) We love one another by using the gifts God entrusted to us to serve others we will be living a stewardship way of life, since we will be following Jesus' example.

One last thought: As St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "*I say this not by way of command, but to test the genuineness of your love by your concern for others*." (2 Cor 8:8) Can I do any less?

Now to Sunday's Gospel:

<u>1SM 26: 2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23; PS 103: 1-4, 8, 10, 12-13; 1</u> COR 15: 45-49; LK 6: 27-38

In today's Gospel, from Luke 6:27-38, Jesus offers a very challenging, seemingly impossible approach to daily life. *"Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you. To the person who strikes you on one cheek, offer the other one as well, and from the person who takes your cloak do not withhold even your tunic."* It makes one want to say, "Seriously, Lord?" And He doesn't stop there. Jesus adds, "*Give to everyone who asks of you, and from the one who takes what is yours do not demand it back.*"

It seems so unfair! That is, unless we look at this way of life from a stewardship point of view. Then, not only does it seem doable (though challenging), but it also actually makes perfect sense. A steward understands clearly that all he or she has and all that he or she is — their very life — is a gift from God given to them from an unfathomable abundance of love. This changes everything! This means "my" clothes, "my" abilities, "my" money, and "my" time — all of it ultimately belongs to God. He entrusted these things to each of us in love to use for His purposes and for His glory.

Does this mean we are to be passive "doormats" to anyone who wants to take advantage of us? Certainly not. Jesus explains this in the next verse of this passage when He says, "*Do to others as you would have them do to you.*" There is nothing wrong with loving oneself since God loves us and has made us in His own image and likeness. Jesus simply asks that we also approach others, and that we share our gifts, with this same attitude. He is giving us a definition here of real love, a steward's love!

Kurowski Kenyan Orphans Fund

24 years ago, parishioners Joe and Julianne Kurowski traveled to Kenya and had their hearts moved by children orphaned because of the AIDS epidemic that ravaged the country.

These children had no parents, no family, and no means of support.

Moved by the Holy Spirit, the Kurowskis became their family.



Knowing it would be difficult for the Kurowskis to properly care for all the orphans, nearly 20 years ago, Holy Trinity Parish decided to partner with Joe and Julianne to help provide basic human necessities – education, food, medical care and shelter – to these children. Many things have changed in two decades. Joe is now gone. Some of the children have died. Some have started families of their own.

But one thing remains constant: the orphans still have no one ... except Julianne.


