




Questions for Faith Sharing Mar. 9 First Sunday of Lent

Stewardship and Christian Disciples

Eighth Sunday in **Ordinary Time** SIR 27: 4-7; PS 92: 2-3, 13-16; 1 COR 15: 54-58; LK 6: 39-45



Today's readings exhort us as Christian disciples to form our minds and hearts into an imitation of Christ so we can better reflect His goodness in our daily lives as stewards of His many gifts to us.

The first reading from Sirach offers timeless counsel: "the fruit of a tree shows the care it has had: so too does one's speech disclose the bent of one's mind. Praise no one before he speaks." Jesus uses the very same analogy in today's Gospel reading from Luke: "A good tree does not bear rotten fruit, nor does a rotten tree bear good fruit. For every tree is known by its own fruit."

Everything we have is a gift from God to be used for His honor and glory. This includes the gift of speech and, even more broadly, all forms of modern-day communication — email, text, TikTok, X (AKA Twitter), Instagram, Facebook, and all the rest. What comes forth from our mouths, or keyboard, or phone, reflects what is in our minds and hearts. It has become so much easier to bully or communicate hatred by using social media than it ever was or is to speak the words face to face. Remember, our ability to communicate with each other, however it is done, is itself a gift from God which we must protect (or "steward") well.

In the same Gospel passage, Jesus reminds us, "No disciple is superior to the teacher; but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher." As Christian stewards we must therefore be trained by Jesus our teacher so that our minds and hearts will be aligned with His mind and heart, and our speech (and actions for that matter) will reflect His goodness.

How do we obtain this training? First and foremost, we can spend time with the Teacher, our Lord: we can study His life through reading the Scriptures, and we can listen and speak with Him in quiet, regular times of prayer. We can expand our faith knowledge through study of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. We can find healing and strength in Reconciliation. We can build up our strength to overcome evil by receiving His Body and Blood in the Eucharist.

The more intentionally and frequently we make use of these means, the more we will become like our Teacher and Lord. Then, all that we do and say (and text and post) will bring others closer to Him. This is the life's work of the Christian steward.



Deacon Jim's something to think about: Lent starts this week with Ash Wednesday, **March 5, 2025**. Try to go to one of the three Masses to receive ashes as a reminder to "*Remember, you are dust and to dust you shall return.*" Let this Lent be a time when you start or re-commit to working toward living a stewardship way of life. Start small – Get up a few minutes early and thank God for the blessings of the day and ask for his help in dealing with the many challenges you will face. Maybe take some time to read from scripture – read the readings for the day. Then, plan to do a small act of kindness for someone during the day.

Finally, close the day with a prayer of thanksgiving for God's help in dealing with all the challenges during the day. Lent isn't just about giving up something, it is about building up our spiritual life and preparing for the Paschal Mystery by using the gifts God has entrusted to us to help others. *Dearest Lord, help me grow in prayer and gratitude during this Lenten Season of 2025*.
