

Questions for Faith Sharing Jan. 5 The Epiphany of the Lord

In next Sunday's Gospel, Matthew 2:1-12, the church celebrates the manifestation of the Son of God to the world. Matthew is also outlining a personal spirituality of seeking and finding. The Magi were students of light; they analyzed patterns among the stars and planets and sought out their meaning. They trusted their knowledge of the light and treated the young Jesus Christ as a worthy recipient of their offerings, no matter what his humble estate. Little is known about the visitors from the East who paid the Holy Family homage, but their story reminds us that great things happen in the humblest of places.

Stewardship...

We close out the year of Our Lord 2024 as we continue to focus on how our Sunday readings help us make God first in our lives by sharing the blessings he has entrusted to us.



The Holy Family experienced many of the same joys and trials that all parents and children experience today. And, so, we can look to this Family for help in our own family lives and see in them a model of stewardship in family life.

The Gospel passage from Luke starts by telling us something about Jesus' parents: "Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of the Passover, and when he was 12 years old, they went up according to festival custom." This Family took seriously the stewardship of their time. The "Holy Couple" or "Sacred Familia" carefully observed the traditions and practice of their Jewish faith and brought up their Son to do the same. They worshiped as a family with their faith community. And they did so faithfully.


We can take their example to heart by doing such things as: making Sunday Mass attendance a priority for our families, making prayer with our family a priority every day, making sure that we regularly celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and by observing in our family life the feasts and fasts appropriate to the liturgical calendar. When we, as families, make our first priority our Time with God and worship of Him we will be imitating the Holy Family.

Read the First Letter from James to see how it draws our family closer to God. "See what love the Father has bestowed on us that we may be called the children of God. And so we are." The love that God has for each of us as one of his children, is the same love that we as parents and grandparents have for our children and grandchildren.

On this Feast of the Holy Family, let us reclaim the beauty and importance of family life. Let's commit to steward our families well in the coming year, making time spent with God and practicing our faith the most important appointments on our family calendars. And by teaching our children and grandchildren the importance of giving back to God by using the gifts he entrusted to us to help others.

Thoughts to reflect on:

God calls each of us, as he did Mary and Joseph to acknowledge him as our highest priority. Mary and Joseph taught Jesus the same lesson – Yahweh comes first. When we do this with our family, we teach our children that our relationship with God is our highest priority, so that it will mold all aspects of their lives – whether in life's big decisions or in the most mundane tasks. God is always first! At the end of each Mass, we are sent out into our world, to reveal the Gospel proclaimed to those we meet, and to demonstrate our love for God by how we use our material gifts to help others. There is no greater New Year's resolution than to make God first in 2025!
